# Constance "Connie" Renee Wilson Collins (1928-2013)

Constance "Connie" Renee Wilson Collins held a high standard of community responsibility as she was not a talker, but a doer. Mrs. Collins coined the phrase "You are your brothers' keeper", and lived by example every day of her life.

A Harvard graduate, African American woman who made a tremendous contribution to the Greater New Britain community, Collins worked to

help people reach their full potential through her work in political, spiritual, fraternal, and non-profit organizations.

Mrs. Collins is an exemplary role model for the youth who participate in programs at the Queen Ann Nzinga Center and the annual concert in celebration of Women's History was renamed in her honor in 2014.


